

The Wyandanch Public Library enters 2026 with renewed purpose expanding programs, strengthening partnerships, and transforming our space into a hub of creativity, education, and belonging. Our dedicated staff continue to deliver services that make a difference, from cultural celebrations and youth innovation labs, to adult learning and digital literacy initiatives.

Adult & Reference Services

The Wyandanch Public Library continues to drive adult learning, cultural enrichment, and community connection through innovative and inclusive programming.
